House Bill No. 4786

Introduced by HON. VINCENT FRANCO D. FRASCO

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to establish a Land Transportation Office (LTO) District Branch in the Municipality of Liloan, Province of Cebu, to cater the needs of the municipality and neighboring municipality such as Compostela.

At present, the only LTO branch in the Fifth Legislative District is located in Danao City, Province of Cebu, which is approximately fifteen (15) kilometers away, more or less, from the Municipality of Liloan, Province of Cebu. Given the thriving economic and tourism activities in the Municipality of Liloan and neighboring towns, the volume of vehicles including motorcycles is rapidly increasing.

If approved, the establishment of the LTO in Liloan will undoubtedly aid in accommodating my constituents' transportation-related transactions within the surrounding areas.

For the above considerations, the passage of this law is earnestly sought.

AN ACT
ESTABLISHING A DISTRICT BRANCH OF THE LAND
TRANSPORTATION OFFICE (LTO) IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF
LILOAN, PROVINCE OF CEBU AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS
THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. There shall be a district branch of the Land of Transportation Office (LTO) to be located in the Municipality of Liloan, Province of Cebu.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Department of Transportation (DOTr) shall immediately include in the Department's programs the operationalization of the LTO District Office in the Municipality of Liloan, Province of Cebu, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SECTION 3. The Secretary of the Department of Transportation (DOTr) shall issue rules and regulations necessary for the effective implementation of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a national newspaper of general circulation.
